This book is about all of the biggest problems in Marin County. Let's start with "Human Rights".

If you are a citizen that is a lawful, senior, disabled, low-income native-born American citizen, who has served his nation and community for decades, and if you, as a citizen, are an individual residing in, and paying rent in, Marin County – Watch Out!

Citizens have been communicating with the Marin County housing agency, since 2008 or so, and they have run into a nightmare of obfuscation, denials, black-listing, corruption, favoritism, crony capitalism and sadness.

"We don't like him because he reports our corruption to the cops" is NOT a legal reason for Marin County to deny any citizen his earned, entitled, HUD Home Ownership Voucher that he has waited longer for than anyone else, yet that is why they have targeted one citizen. As one digs deeper, it turns out this has happened to a vast number of Marin's citizens.

The bureaucratic section of the Marin political crooks are at Marin County Offices on Redwood Road and 4020 Civic Center Drive in San Rafael and, also, In Sacramento, California with homes in nearby cities.

All of the true names and capacities of the Marin political crooks, ("DOES 1 through 50", in legal terms), inclusive, will be unknown to you, the citizen, at the beginning of such a ruckus, but you as a citizen should sue those Marin political crooks, each of them, by such fictitious names pursuant to the pertinent provisions of the California Code of Civil Procedure. The facts and veracity of the charges and claims can be evidenced in hard drives and existing online cloud-based evidence repositories containing millions of pages of validating evidence compiled by citizens, HUD, OSHA, FBI, GAO, SEC, EU, private, Congressional, news industry, forensic specialist and leaked archive investigators. This book only contains a tiny percentage of the vast number of incident reports about corruption, government account skimming, payola, crony capitalism and insider stock trading coming out of Marin County.

Politicians and their Tiburon insiders store many of their bribe profits as fine art held in Swiss and Spanish bank vaults. That used to be a safe way to hide their ill gotten gains. It no longer is as of this book being published. Ironically, you can drive around Tiburon and Belvedere at night and see tens of millions of dollars of non-IRS reported art hanging on walls in oligarch's mansions.... Oooops!

For example, The HUD Federal Housing Home Ownership Choice Voucher program is a key program in section 8 of the United States Housing Act of 1937. (42 U.S.C. § 1437 et seq., as amended by § 201(a)of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974.) Commonly referred to as "Section 8," the program provides low-income families a monthly subsidy to pay for a portion of their mortgage. The amount of the subsidy depends, in part, on the income Section 8 families receive. The program, which is funded and regulated by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development(HUD), is administered locally by public housing authorities (PHAs).

Marin County's PHA has some problems, though.

One Marin citizen has been applying for and waiting for a government-promised home notice since 2008. He wanted the Home Ownership Voucher to build, or buy, his own home which will help to solve California's housing crisis by demonstrating new housing solutions. Because the tech billionaires live in Marin, they don't want housing or poor people in Marin because they might scuff their Tesla's and diffuse their political control of Marin agencies.

HUD, and many others, have sued Marin for refusing to do anything but the barest minimum for low income people. Marin efforts relative to Marin County money-on-hand amounts to mere "window dressing" insincere facade efforts to help the masses. Many Federal government agencies have rated Marin County as "*The richest county in the world that does the least to support low income people.*" Let's face the facts: Marin County bosses hates anybody that is not a rich white male with a mansion. It goes beyond simply "*snooty*" to an agency mentality that verges on *evil*.

Because the Marin program is operationally "gate-keeper"- controlled through a single person in Marin County it has created conflicts of interest and abuses of process with no oversight or transparency. The vast numbers of lawsuits filed against Marin county by everybody from citizens to *HUD itself*, show that there is a huge transparency and bias problem here. (per http://www.pacer.gov) The only "criteria" that Marin Housing seems to use is: "Do we like your politics and can we use this for our friends funding skims." Your

actual legal rights and legal criteria compliance do not matter in Marin County!




Figure 1: Flyers Posted In Marin County In Mill Valley And San Rafael By Artist Forums

Each Marin Housing staff person has highly visible social media, photo gallery, event attendance, political support and ideological statements publicly visible on the internet. Additionally, many of their personal emails have been leaked. This data, along with evidence visible in their work cubicles (Huge numbers of pictures of them wearing "pink knitted ANTIFA caps" and political posters in their cubicles, for example), their Instagrams, their Facebook profiles, etc. display clear biases, political hatreds and personal vendettas against everybody from "*Trump*", to "*Starbucks*", to "*Strip Malls*" to "*Disco Dancers*". Marin County workers never leave their politics at home. Defendant gatekeepers have clearly displayed their bias and discrimination interests for all to see, so it is hard for Marin County political crooks to argue that they "don't have any bias".

In 1974, Congress added the Section 8 housing program to the United States Housing Act of 1937 "[f]or the purpose of aiding low-income families in obtaining a decent place to live." (42 U.S.C. § 1437f(a); see generally Friedman et al., Cal. Practice Guide: Landlord-Tenant (The Rutter Group 2019) ¶12.) The program gives eligible families either "tenant-based" or "project-based" rent subsidies administered locally through PHAs. (See Park Village Apartment Tenants Ass'n v. Mortimer Howard Trust(9th Cir. 2011) 636 F.3d 1150, 1152–1153 [overview of Section 8 housing assistance].) ""[T]enant-based assistance" is a home ownership subsidy that is tied to a specific family even if the family moves to other suitable housing. (42 U.S.C.J.4§1437f(f) (7).) ""[P]roject-based assistance," on the other hand, is tied to a specific housing development or unit. (42 U.S.C. §1437f(f)(6).)We focus on tenant-based home ownership assistance, which is at issue in this case. Under the tenant-based assistance program, at least 75% of all admitted families must be "[e]xtremely low[]income,"i.e., their income may not exceed 30% of the median income calculated by HUD for the relevant area (24 C.F.R. §5.603(b)(2020)); and all remaining admitted families must be "[l]ow income," i.e., their income may not exceed 50% of the median income. (Ibid.; id., §982.201(b)(1),(2)(i)(2020)[eligibility and targeting].) After a Section 8 family selects an eligible home approved by the applicable PHA, the PHA enters into a contract with the bank. The bank "functions as a landlord in the private market. The bank signs a contract with the Section 8 home buyer (which includes a HUD Lease/Tenancy Addendum) and also signs a Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) contract with the Housing Authority." (Apartment Assn. of Los Angeles County, Inc. v. City of Los Angeles(2006) 136 Cal.App.4th 119, 123.) The PHA gives the subsidy payments directly to the bank. (24 C.F.R. § 982.311(a)(2020).)

The above-mentioned citizen has asked Marin Housing, for years "...how many people in Marin County received any kind of section voucher and why did they get to jump ahead of me? While everyone knows that vouchers are based on criteria, NO INVESTIGATOR has been able to find a single post-2012 voucher recipient who had as complete a set of

criteria compliance as me. Why is that unless, I was targeted? Why wasn't the fact that I exceeded all of the qualifications criteria not as good as those who got a voucher who were not as qualified? Why were the 42+ emails, web form submissions, letters and meetings I had with Marin Housing "lost" or deleted? Why are there so many ex Marin housing and county staff describing and suing against Marin County for "targeting" by Marin County staff?..." Marin Housing refuses to answer those questions.

Many Marin residents have filed a vast number of emails, requests, voucher applications, letters, reports and other notifications and attended meetings to join the HUD Home Ownership Voucher program since 2008, but, every time they called the Marin Housing Department (Gale Suits in particular in later years), they were told, "we have no record of you.". If a citizen then resubmits the application, or re-meets with staff, a few months later they are told: "We have no record of you". Marin Housing staff who have left County employment have told citizens that they were "black-listed" by County officials because they exposed corruption shenanigans by public officials.

To be clear: You get deleted and shadow-banned by your own public officials, the people THAT ARE EMPLOYED BY YOU, if you speak up or have an opinion!

Checks cashed by Marin County show that they, indeed, have a record. In fact these kinds of cases can now depose every *personal* and office email account of each Marin County Housing official since 2012 with the knowledge that many of those individuals emails, and Marin County email servers were previously hacked. Any "missing emails" can now be found by compared leaked document sets with email PST and server files provided by Marin political crooks.

Applicants are stone-walled with their HUD approved housing benefits and placed on County-manipulated "waiting lists" that have been held-back in order to harm Applicants in political reprisal and to keep "the poors" out of Marin, which is just designed for the rich.

A number of citizens were working in Marin Housing with their office Section 8 lead, a black man, who had promised to provide the voucher papers to many, BUT he suddenly quit Marin Housing in disgust saying that Marin Housing was a "*dysfunctional biased racist mess*".

It is a FELONY for County, or other officials, to "Shadow-Ban" and database-manipulate Applicant's benefits applications in ongoing political reprisal. Many Applicants are veterans and life-long public servants devoted to their community who deserve far better than a ten year blockade of their housing rights based on Marin's elitist bias for tech millionaires.

It is an absolute falsehood for County officials to state that Applicants have been equitably and fairly placed on agency lists and HUD housing and HUD mortgage financing resource lists.

While Marin political crooks argue that Applicants have been processed equal to others in processing lists or access to HUD and County housing resources, it is, in fact, now documented by law enforcement, investigative journalists and Edward Snowden-like leakers that Applicants have been stone-walled using, now exposed, "Lois Lerner"-like black-holing tactics in reprisal for Applicant's, and his peers, highly successful support of anti-corruption law enforcement cases.

Applicant's have learned from other agencies, including Marin's Ritter Center, that a vast number of people received Section 8 vouchers from the County ahead of non-favored Applicants even though other Applicants have been applying years before any of those who got County support. Additionally, many of those who got County support are not natural U.S. citizens and very few of them have worked on SE 1099 and W2 employment in the USA and contributed as much to the tax base as veterans and other Applicants who got stone-walled.

Marin County's excuse of being "too disorganized in their own offices" is NO excuse. What if the Pentagon said that the reason America lost a war was because the generals were "too disorganized in their own offices". The public would string them up. Being "too disorganized" is not a viable excuse for the wealthiest County in the world. There IS a war on housing and Marin County has gone to great lengths to make sure that the war is already lost in their jurisdiction.

Outside of the County across the bay where the Berkeley campus is, Marin has the most activists of almost any other county. Political hit jobs on effective members of the public, by Marin Officials, is a daily occurrence.

There was a very obvious political hit job placed on one Applicant because he is so good at getting criminally corrupt politicians fired and helping the federal authorities with corruption clean-up campaigns. At least two U.S. Senators have communicated their hatred of one Applicant, because those politicians are now under FBI investigation. Those Senator's and/or their staff, have communicated "orders to harm Applicant" to public officials in Marin as political reprisal.

Many Applicants have emailed, engaged in personal interviews, filed County requests, filed federal requests, sent letters to every known County housing operator, filled out waiting list requests and otherwise engage in all known reasonable attempts to secure their overtly earned benefits. They got their rights violated. They got stone-walled. They got political retaliation.

HUD needs to AGAIN sue Marin County and the FBI needs to forensically audit ALL government funds that were sent to Marin County since 2012. Government funds in Marin County get "skimmed" by politicians and put in those politicians personal accounts.

The issue of hacked documents is a significant issue in these cases. In communication with HUD counselors, some of those agencies provided links to their entire server files which exposed the names, addresses, phone numbers, poverty status, emails and other records of their clients. They also exposed direct server access for hackers to easily exploit. We have informed each agency and they have now deleted the materials but other agency systems are known to be at risk and we do not have the resources to address them all. Marin County "hacked itself" in some cases, by sending out open access to their servers.

In most of the leaked emails of Marin Housing staff, they appear to have been hacked by third parties enabled by terrible IT security in Marin County. Whereas, numerous Congressional reports, IT staff reports and security industry reports have verified that agency servers and files, including those upon which citizens records were housed, have been hacked, moved, deleted and edited by outside third parties including Chinese, Iranian and Russian hackers, bored teens and hired opposition research operatives and that the hardware level back-doors for SPECTRE, Solarwinds and many other incursion sets still exist in agency Cisco, Intel, Juniper Networks and other Network devices now connected to government file networks at DOE, SSA, FEC, and other agencies and this fact is indisputable. At the very least, China, Russian or Brazilian teen hackers have them up for sale on the Dark Web. The NSA certainly has copies of them.

Per the FBI, DOJ, FCC and Congressional investigators: It is widely verified by the U.S. DOJ that hackers such as Wang Dong, Sun Kailiang, Wen Xinyu, Huang Zhenyu, and Gu Chunhui, who were officers in Unit 61398 of the Third Department of the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) and Aleksei Sergeyevich Morenets, 41, Evgenii Mikhaylovich, Serebriakov, 37, Ivan Sergeyevich Yermakov, 32, Artem Andreyevich Malyshev, 30, and Dmitriy Sergeyevich Badin, 27, who were each assigned to Military Unit 26165, and Oleg Mikhaylovich Sotnikov, 46, and Alexey Valerevich Minin, 46, who were also GRU officers, and hackers-for-hire including Kevin David Mitnick, Adrian Lamo, Albert Gonzalez, Matthew Bevan, Richard Pryce, Jeanson James Ancheta, Michael Calce, Kevin Poulsen, Jonathan James, The hacker known as ASTRA, The hacker known as GUCIFER, The hacker known as ANON 4CHAN and THOUSANDS of other individuals had free acess and free reign throughout NSA, FBI, SSA, HUD, DOJ, OPM, CIA and other government servers via the SPECTRE, EMOTET, PRIME ROOTKIT, SERCOMM BACKDOOR, NOTPETYA, MELTDOWN, MASTERKEY, RYZENFALL, FALLOUT, CHIMERA, and hundreds of other back doors and penetration vulnerabities in

Cisco, Intel, Juniper Networks, AMD, and other equipment. Additionally, all of the core server penetration tools used by the CIA and the NSA were hacked by foreign nations and their core source code posted on the internet for all to use. The Bohemian Club, just outside of Marin, was famously hacked by Guccifer. It is ludicrous for any agency to state that any government servers, prior to 2020, were not widely penetrated and manipulated. The hackers are all known to have sold, or provided the results of their work to famous politicians for use against their competitors. Even Nancy Pelosi has supported such hackers for political tricks. She is an owner and financier of the hacking manipulation firm: CROWDSTRIKE. Crowdstrike and famous California Senators had the easy means, the motivations, the staffing, the resources and the known engagement of services to manipulate SSA, DOJ, SEC, FTC and other agency decisions and filing records in order to harm A citizens, reporters and whistle-blowers who reported their crimes and corruptions.

Per our FBI contacts, the hackers, daily, use these common tools to hack County servers and look for "juicy opportunities". They use these tactics which appear to work on Marin County servers:

A. Injection. Injection flaws, such as SQL, NoSQL, OS, and LDAP injection, occur when untrusted data is sent to an interpreter as part of a command or query. The attacker's hostile data can trick the interpreter into executing unintended commands or accessing data without proper authorization.

B. Broken Authentication. Application functions related to authentication and session management are often implemented incorrectly, allowing attackers to compromise passwords, keys, or session tokens, or to exploit other implementation flaws to assume other users' identities temporarily or permanently.

C. Sensitive Data Exposure. Many web applications and APIs do not properly protect sensitive data, such as financial, healthcare, and PII. Attackers may steal or modify such weakly protected data to conduct credit card fraud, identity theft, or other crimes. Sensitive data may be compromised without extra protection, such as encryption at rest or in transit, and requires special precautions when exchanged with the browser.

D. XML External Entities (XXE). Many older or poorly configured XML processors evaluate external entity references within XML documents. External

entities can be used to disclose internal files using the file URI handler, internal file shares, internal port scanning, remote code execution, and denial of service attacks.

E. Broken Access Control. Restrictions on what authenticated users are allowed to do are often not properly enforced. Attackers can exploit these flaws to access unauthorized functionality and/or data, such as access other users' accounts, view sensitive files, modify other users' data, change access rights, etc.

F. Security Misconfiguration. Security misconfiguration is the most commonly seen issue. This is commonly a result of insecure default configurations, incomplete or ad hoc configurations, open cloud storage, misconfigured HTTP headers, and verbose error messages containing sensitive information. Not only must all operating systems, frameworks, libraries, and applications be securely configured, but they must be patched/upgraded in a timely fashion.

G. Cross-Site Scripting XSS. XSS flaws occur whenever an application includes untrusted data in a new web page without proper validation or escaping, or updates an existing web page with user-supplied data using a browser API that can create HTML or JavaScript. XSS allows attackers to execute scripts in the victim's browser which can hijack user sessions, deface web sites, or redirect the user to malicious sites.

H. Insecure Deserialization. Insecure deserialization often leads to remote code execution. Even if deserialization flaws do not result in remote code execution, they can be used to perform attacks, including replay attacks, injection attacks, and privilege escalation attacks.

I. Using Components with Known Vulnerabilities. Components, such as libraries, frameworks, and other software modules, run with the same privileges as the application. If a vulnerable component is exploited, such an attack can facilitate serious data loss or server takeover. Applications and APIs using components with known vulnerabilities may undermine application defenses and enable various attacks and impacts.

J. Insufficient Logging & Monitoring. Insufficient logging and monitoring, coupled with missing or ineffective integration with incident response, allows attackers to further attack systems, maintain persistence, pivot to more systems, and tamper, extract, or destroy data. Most breach studies show time to detect a breach is over 200 days, typically detected by external parties rather than internal processes or monitoring.

All of Marin Counties Servers and Marin Housing personal android, iPhone, Gmail, MS Outlook and related accounts and devices are known to have been susceptible to, and exploited by, the above methods. The accounts of Gale Suits, Taija Aguirre, Latitia Rogers,

Kimbereley Carroll, Noele Kostelic, Jill Symkowick. are thought to have been leaked. The leaked documents issue is crucial because if the Marin political crooks deny that certain communications "can't be found" or "are lost" or "never happened", such outside versions can be used to verify the veracity via dark web sellers or others. In fact, citizens filed some of these charges with Federal investigators years ago, and one must presume that the FBI, HUD (who has sued and investigated Marin Housing previously) may also have acquired copy of all of those staff office and personal emails. Marin political crooks are, thus, advised to not lie about the contact history with Applicants.

In a lawsuit filed on January 31 in Marin County Superior Court, multiple Marin residents charge that the County uses illegal and unfair While California law requires counties to distribute GA funds fairly, the lawsuit charges that Marin County shirks this duty by running its GA program like a corrupt garage sale for public policy.

As of July 27, 2021, he found out that the Federal Government and numerous citizens have sued Marin County for a vast number of targeting and discrimination matters. Even though Marin County is rather small, it has an inordinate number of lawsuits for abuses of civil rights and corruption. It is shocking to see how vast these public policy dirty deeds extend.

In one case, after waiting over a decade Gayle Suits, the Family Self Sufficiency/HCV Homeownership Coordinator for Marin Couny, who has had interaction with the Applicants for years, told an Applicant that "NO" he can't have the home ownership voucher he had waited for since 2008. The Constitution says that when the procedure is unjust, the procedure must be changed to be just. The law also says that when the public administrator is unjust, the administrator must be changed. The only consistent factor in the huge number of justice lawsuits against Marin County, shown on http://www.pacer.gov is the administrators. The situation speaks for itself.

The political corruption matter of "skimming state and federal funds" from stimulus and emergency funds is clearly documented in the document as well as the feature films: "HOW POLITICAL CORRUPTION WORKS", "OMERTA" and the related CBS News 60 Minutes Episodes. Additionally, the favoritism, black-listing and crony-capitalism charges are deeply documented using FBI, DOJ, HUD, FTC and Congressional investigation case files.

One Applicant described the matter to federal officials who said that this issue demonstrates that Marin officials actions are: "discriminatory, arbitrary, capricious, confiscatory and oppressive, and the same is unconstitutional, null and void, and constitutes an unreasonable exercise of power on the part of you and the County of Marin," and they and HUD are holding that <u>A citizen is entitled</u> to his HUD Home

Ownership Voucher! ..Even more so than all other Applicant's in light of what he has had to endure! The citizen has demanded that this matter be moved to a Federal Department Of Justice investigation as a follow-up to the existing case number previous DOJ and HUD investigations and previous discrimination lawsuits documented on www.pacer.gov against your offices and Marin County!

HUD has caught Marin County doing crooked things before, ie:

I. INTRODUCTION

The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (hereinafter referred to as the Department or HUD) pursuant to its law enforcement responsibilities under Section 109 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, conducted a compliance review of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program administered by the County of Marin (hereinafter referred to as the County or Recipient). The purpose of the review was to determine whether the CDBG program managed by the County is administered in compliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of Section 109, Title VI, and Section 504.

The Department conducted an on-site review of the Recipient during the period June 29-July 2, 2009. The areas reviewed included Citizen Participation; Benefits, Services and Methods of Administration; Section 504 programmatic requirements; and a limited physical accessibility survey.

The review disclosed that the program is administered in general compliance with regulations implementing Section 109 (24 CFR Part 6), Title VI (24 CFR Part 1), and Section 504 (24 CFR Part 8). However, the Department found that the County was in preliminary non-compliance with: 24 CFR §6.6, citizen participation; 24 CFR §§1.6, 6.10, and 8.55, record-keeping; 24 CFR §§1.4, 6.4, and 8.4, meaningful participation; 24 CFR §8.6, communications; 24 CFR §§1.4 and 6.4, affirmatively furthering fair housing; and, 24 CFR §§8.20 and 8.21, program and physical accessibility. The Department identified a number of programmatic concerns regarding the Recipient's administration of the program in areas that were reviewed, as well.

Marin Housing was found to be engaging in negligent activities and sketchy operations. Even today, Marin Housing's Below-Market-Rate (BMR) homes are such pieces of crap with insanely high "HOA Fees" that provide nothing of value, that make them unaffordable to most SSA, SSA and SSDI low income people and HUD does not like that. HUD wonders why the richest, mansion-filled county in America can only come up with pathetic hovels to offer in their BMR program.

Many of the Silicon Valley/SF tech oligarchs may work in Silicon Valley or San Francisco but they sleep in Marin. Over 20 billion dollars of tech personal assets sleeps/lives in Tiburon/Belvedere, alone, and they tell the Marin County government what to do, and who to do it to.




Figure 2: Many Marinites Want Their Own Homes But They Don't Want "Poors" To Get Theirs

Some of the named Marin political crooks herein, and each of the parties designated and every one of them, are legally responsible jointly and severally for the Federal RICO Statute-violating events and happenings referred to in this book. They engaged in causes of action including causing a Complaint for Intentional Interference with Contractual Relations, Intentional Interference with Prospective Economic Advantage, Cyberstalking, Fraud, Invasion of Privacy, Unfair Competition and Theft of Intellectual Property, RICO statute violations and other causes of action.

Marin County crooks have formed a "Cartel", as defined by law under RICO Racketeering Statutes and were the financiers of the political campaigns and received payola and kickbacks from those campaigns via government stimulus payments for 2008 and 2020 national issues. Over a TRILLION dollars of COVID, 2008 Housing Crisis and 2020 Stimulus funds have been announced by Congress and aimed at California but, mysteriously, it never shows up in public projects in Marin. Whose pockets did it end up in? Let's take a look!

Investigators have been monitoring the California Department of Housing & Community Development reports, emails, hearings and newsletters for over a decade and Marin County is notable in all of the communications in that it avoids certain public support efforts with respect to all other counties in California. For example, even though Marin County is a deeply agricultural region, Marin County had zero presence in the *Joe Serna*, *Jr*. Farmworker Housing Grant (FWHG) program, February 25, 2021, NOFA Awardee List from the California Department of Housing & Community Development. Further, California Department of Housing & Community Development officials have stated that "Marin County made little or no effort to participate". Point Reyes officials reported that "Farmworker housing advocates are facing some hard lessons from a pilot project that fell drastically short of its goal. Starting in 2012, a collaborative between the Marin Community Foundation and Marin County used a combination of public and private funds to build and renovate agricultural worker housing on ranches in West Marin. The group initially planned to fund 200 units within five years, but later sharply reduced the goal to 20 units. In the end, only a dozen units were built, while the need for more affordable housing never went away and ACTUALLY increased by over 800%.

Marin officials seek retaliation against citizens that speak up because citizens have been able to accomplish what corrupt politicians have failed to do. Marin officials seek retaliation, revenge, vendetta, omerta, reprisal and payback against citizens because some citizens have walked the talk against corruption and put public officials in prison. It is a felony violation of the law for Marin officials to do what Marin officials do in retaliation. HUD, and federal law says: "**Retaliation Is Illegal -** It is illegal to retaliate against any person for making a complaint, testifying, assisting, or participating in any manner in a proceeding under HUD's complaint process at any time, even after the investigation has

been completed. The Fair Housing Act also makes it illegal to retaliate against any person because that person reported a discriminatory practice to a housing provider or other authority. If you believe you have experienced retaliation, you can file a complaint."

Violations by Marin County crooks include, but are not limited to: Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (race, color, national origin); Section 109 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (race, color, national origin, religion, sex); Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (disability); Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (disability); Architectural Barriers Act of 1968 (disability); Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (age); Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972 (sex), civil rights, whistle-blower rights, State and Federal Constitutional Rights and many, many more.

In exchange for financing political campaigns, Marin political crooks are illegally exchanging profits and stock market perks from <u>state and federal emergency funds</u>. This is an illegal quid-pro-quo arrangement.

Marin County crooks operate a criminal CARTEL, as defined by federal RICO LAWS, and that Cartel runs an anti-trust-violating market rigging and crony political payola operation. - Some applicants found themselves strangely poisoned, not unlike the Alexander Litvenko and Rodgers cases. The federal MSDS documents clearly show that a number of these people were exposed to deadly compounds and radiations without being provided with proper HazMat suits which DOE officials knew were required.
- Applicants employers were called, and faxed, and ordered to fire applicants from their places of employment, in the middle of the day, with no notice, as a retribution tactic.
- Applicants HR and employment records, on recruiting and hiring databases, were embedded with negative keywords in order to prevent them from gaining future employment.
- One Gary D. Conley (shot in the head behind Beale Air Force Base) and one Rajeev Motwani (Electro-shocked in his back yard and dumped in his swimming pool face down), both whistle-blowers in this matter, turned up dead under strange circumstances. They are not alone in a series of bizarre deaths related to these hi-jinks.
- Disability and VA complaint hearings and benefits were frozen, delayed, denied or subjected to lost records and "missing hard drives" as in the Lois Lerner case.
- Paypal and other on-line payments for on-line sales were delayed, hidden, or re-directed in order to terminate income potential for applicants who competed with political interests and holdings.
- DNS redirection, website spoofing which sent applicants websites to dead ends and other Internet activity manipulations were conducted.

- Campaign finance dirty tricks contractors IN-Q-Tel, Think Progress, Media Matters, Gawker Media, Syd Blumenthal, etc., were hired by political Executives and their campaign financiers to attack applicants who competed with political executives stocks and personal assets.
- Covert political partner: Google, transferred large sums of cash to dirty tricks contractors and then manually locked the media portion of the attacks into the top lines of the top pages of all Google searches globally, for years, with hidden embedded codes in the links and web-pages which multiplied the attacks on applicants by many magnitudes.
- Honeytraps and moles from persons employed by Marin political crooks or living on, or with, Marin political crooks were employed by the attackers. In this tactic, people who covertly worked for the attackers were employed to approach the "target" and offer business or sexual services in order to spy on and misdirect the subject.
- Mortgage and rental applications had red flags added to them in databases to prevent the targets from getting homes or apartments.
- McCarthy-Era "Black-lists" were created and employed against applicants who competed with political executives and their campaign financiers to prevent them from funding and future employment. The Silicon Valley Cartel (AKA the "PayPal Mafia" or the "Silicon Valley Mafia") placed A citizen on their "Black-List".

Federal corruption hearings and court trials in Washington DC, and elsewhere, have proven these facts and ruled that citizens were in fact subjected to reprisal, vendetta and retribution actions financed and directed in part by Marin political crooks.

House Ethics investigators and San Jose Mercury News investigators have provided additional evidence and verifying data.

Tens of billions of dollars of profits were acquired by Marin political crooks while infringing citizen rights, and Marin political crooks sought to damage and delay citizens ability to seek recovery.

While sitting through another day of AV Production Fundamentals last year, junior Beth Desta got into a heated argument with a boy sitting next to her in class.

Desta doesn't remember what instigated the conflict. What she does vividly recall, though, is the boy's response.

"He disagreed with me. He just looked at me in the eyes and called me the n-word," Desta said.

According to Desta, the use of racial slurs, including the n-word, is commonplace at Mill Valley. In her experience, white students callously use the word while joking with their

friends or singing along to popular songs, while they lack an understanding of the deep racist roots of the word — or meaningful consequences for its usage at school.

While Desta described principal Tobie Waldeck as extremely upset about the incident, the student who called her the n-word to her face received two days' in-school suspension, which proved to her that "the administration doesn't really care."

Sophomore Ryan Lucas shares Desta's disappointment in the school's response to the use of racist slurs at school. After a student in Lucas's World History class called her the n-word and Lucas reported it, the student received a three-hour detention. To Lucas, the punishment was woefully inadequate.

"With all the history of that word, with slavery and Jim Crow and all of that, it should have been a lot more than just a three-hour detention," Lucas said.

Desta shares her disappointment regarding the inconsistency and lack of severity in the school's punishments for racial slurs, referencing a black student who received two days of out-of-school suspension. Desta's harasser received only one day of out-of-school suspension, and Lucas's received zero days of out-of-school suspension.

"I just don't think they handle it seriously enough when it comes to non-black people saying the n-word. A black kid got suspended for even longer for saying it," Desta said.

Cater notes that the consequences for using racial slurs are determined by the principal based on "the student's age and maturity, the nature and seriousness of the infraction, the student's previous disciplinary record, and any other relevant factors." He also explains that consequences for the use of racial slurs can range from a detention to a long-term suspension.

While the claim that white students who use racial slurs are punished too lightly is disputed, the harm the slurs cause to minority students cannot be understated. After she was racially harassed, Desta wanted to transfer.

"After that, my mindset was, 'Mill Valley is racist. Mill Valley is racist. Everyone here sucks,'" Desta said. Even when Desta isn't individually attacked at school, the atmosphere of rampant racist language and attitudes hurts her.

"I come back from school in a bad mood most days. There are some days where I come to school in a good mood, and I also leave in a good mood," Desta said. "There are other times where it's like, even if no one's saying anything to me, or to anyone, in a derogatory

way, it still kind of hits. It's still like, 'Okay, this is the school I go to where people don't know or understand their limits.'"

Lucas believes that despite the prevalence of racist language at Mill Valley, the school hasn't taken enough steps to raise awareness about the issue; to her, that's something that needs to change.

"There definitely needs to be some type of awareness. It should be common knowledge not to use the n-word," Lucas said, "I don't understand why it's not, especially with all the history behind it."

Desta agrees; in fact, she blames the school's failure to raise awareness for the rise of racist language.

The city council of **Mill Valley**, CA, a wealthy city north of San Francisco, voted unanimously to effectively halt installation of new small cell towers to accommodate 5G technology over health concerns. The "urgency ordinance" will bar applications for 5G towers while the city drafts a more permanent rule.

Perhaps more surprisingly, the liberal haven maintains some of California's strictest prohibitions against cannabis businesses, which are completely banned in a number of towns and in the unincorporated areas of Marin County.

It seems that Marin, with its picturesque woodlands and marinas, liberal politics and tony boutiques, is far less cannabis-friendly than its voting record suggests.

No Van Sleeping, No Cannabis Stores

Perhaps the first cue was years ago when, after pilgrimages of hippies trekked to Marin to witness the Dead live on stage, the county made it a crime to sleep in a van.

These days, Marin County is home to billion-dollar companies like Autodesk software, BioMarin biopharmaceuticals and the luxury home décor retailer Restoration Hardware. The average price is a house here is about \$1.25 million. And the locals—at least those in political power—appear to view cannabis shops and cannabis farming as a threat to the community character, just as loathsome as a Walmart store. (Of which there are none within the county lines.)

When it comes to cannabis, local jurisdictions "are banning instead of licensing," Shaw says. Even in Fairfax, where the vote in favor of Proposition 64 was nearly 78 percent, she is uncertain whether the Town Council will authorize a permit for her to sell cannabis for adult use. Why not? Fear of increased traffic to her dispensary, she says, including talk of her store's negative influence on local youth.

"Keep in mind, this is a very wealthy community," Shaw adds. "People feel dispensaries will devalue that extremely expensive real estate, and they don't want cars and commerce. This is socially liberal place but also a closed, cloistered community of hard-working people who want their peace and quiet and they want to be discreet.

"I would say the electeds here have not gotten in touch with modern times, which is typical for Marin County. It's frustrating."

Mill Valley Mayor Sashi McEntee gathered outdoors Thursday with community members to personally apologize for a controversial comment made during a livestreamed City Council meeting Monday night regarding Black Lives Matter and the ongoing George Floyd protests across the nation.

<u>KCBS Radio</u> reported McEntee met with an "angry group" of residents in the town's Depot Plaza and the <u>Marin Independent Journal</u> reported that McEntee listened to critics vent "as community outrage continued" over her remark.

The <u>Marin IJ</u> reported that more than 100 residents attended the meeting and MeEntee addressed the crowd with a microphone.

"I apologize for what I said," she said. "First of all we can't talk about things that are brought up during public open time, and two, it's council policy we don't take up national issues."

At Monday's City Council meeting, a constituent submitted a question asking what Mill Valley is doing to show that Black Lives Matter.

McEntee responded, "It is a council policy that we do not take action on issues that are not of immediate local importance." This seemed to prove that white, elitist, ultraprivileged Mill Valley is as much of a stuck up center of white materialism as ever!

<u>The comment was subsequently amplified by comedian, activist</u> and East Bay local W. Kamau Bell, who tweeted it with the caption, "The Bay Area always gets credit for being the most liberal & progressive place, but it often seems to go out of its way to reject that reputation."

I was not impeding traffic in ANY way. She honks and yells, and I wave at her and yell out, "What? What do you want me to do?" then she speeds off yelling and gesturing. calmly (honestly, I was calm and courteous... no really, I was!) say, "please calm down and be safe, I don't want an accident. Please just be safe, you could kill me." She yells some more to 'move over' to the surprise of other drivers (who saw what happened), and I ride off to let her have a shitty day.

I go to the Mill Valley police website since her license plate was easy (license plate redacted) to remember, and I file a report and a complaint. Apparently the Mill Valley police will send a letter chastizing her, but with no legal implications at all unless several more complaints are lodged.

Now, I know I was legally and morally in the right, but I also know she 1) doesn't recognize that she probably shouldn't be driving if she can't determine that she can easily and safely go by, and 2) probably hates cyclists and will never learn to be polite under any circumstances.

Here's the question: Does my notifying the police and trying to talk to her help us as cyclists?

- The woman doesn't care, will this make her more hostile toward cyclists? Or is there a slim chance she will tone done her aggression?
- The police should know that cyclists matter and have a voice, but in a broad generalization, we're more looked upon as a revenue source for tickets than a valid class of vehicles, and therefore much diminished in clout. Does this annoy cops or help get our message across?
- I tried to be extra polite when I caught her, partly because I knew she'd continue yelling, and mostly because other drivers were watching and would potentially hear what I had to say. Does this help at all (again, I highly doubt it helped the driver see the error, but perhaps her teenage granddaughter in the backseat will talk to her later?) or does it simply make more drivers think 'there goes another asshole cyclist'?

I simply dream for a day when everyone has to ride a bike at least once a month to learn how to be better members of the driving and human community.

MILL VALLEY, CA — The mayor of Mill Valley's yuppie elitist response to a racially sensitive question has sparked outrage on social media.

Mill Valley residents and others online accused Mayor Sashi McEntee of mishandling the question during the public comment portion of Monday's City Council meeting.

A community member submitted a comment about a "white silence is violence" sign that was taken down in downtown Mill Valley.

"Mill Valley is, in many ways, a place of privilege, yet the crisis facing our country is, and should, affect us all," wrote the citizen, who noted that the sign was torn down within 12 hours.

"Our question is simple: What is Mill Valley doing to show that Black Lives Matter?" he asked.

McEntee briefly responded to the question.

"It is a council policy that we do not take action on issues that are not of immediate local importance," she said. "But we appreciate hearing everybody's comments."

A video of the mayor's remarks was uploaded to YouTube on Tuesday. As of Wednesday morning, the video already had more than 20,000 views and over 100 comments. The video was also widely shared on Twitter, causing "Mill Valley" to trend Tuesday night.

"I stand with Black Lives Matter," Linda Price wrote. "Not of immediate local importance? Ridiculous. It is of importance for every American no matter where you live. It is about human dignity."

"Absolutely shocking," Roz Bicen wrote. "What planet are they on? Privilege obviously means you don't have to care for things that don't impact on your own life. Utterly tragic."

"How shameful of you to say that when you are brown," Trixie Perez wrote. "Black lives matter and it is of importance even in Mill Valley."

"Something tells me Mill Valley is getting a new mayor soon," Macey Payne wrote.

Many people online were not satisfied with McEntee's statement, including current and former Mill Valley residents.

"I grew up in Mill Valley. I am Black. I matter," Keith Lawton responded on Twitter. "Mill Valley never showed me that I mattered."

"This wasn't an appropriate or acceptable response to the question," Jim Prosser wrote. "Every municipality, including us here in Mill Valley, needs to reckon with the sanctity of black life and address how to affirm it."

"This isn't good enough Mayor," Brian Law wrote. "I'm a black homeowner in Mill Valley and trust me when I say this is a local issue. Do better and set the right example of how to lead. Lord knows we could use some leaders to be proud of in this moment."

Over the last week, people have taken to the streets in cities across the country in support of the Black Lives Matter movement and against police brutality after the death of George Floyd, a black man who died Memorial Day in Minneapolis after being taken into police custody.



The Mind Numbing Corruption And Perversions In Marin County In California

Recognized for it's rolling green hills and freshly scrubbed blonde yuppies, Marin County in Northern California is supposed to be Heaven-on-Earth but a peek behind the scenes reveals Marin to be operated by crony criminals and ridden with pedophiles and anal sex fanatics. Even when you die in Marin County, the official may still rape your body and the tax people will rape your estate. In typical Marin County corruption case; Marin official's girlfriend, on stand in Marin corruption trial, recounts crimes

A girlfriend of Brett Richards, the former Ross Valley Sanitary District manager, testified Monday that she accompanied him on trips to Las Vegas, Europe, Alaska, the Cayman Islands and the Philippines after Richards received a \$350,000 housing assistance loan from the district.

Richards is standing trial in Marin County Superior Court on charges that he took the loan from the district and never purchased housing.

Lynne Andonian, an assistant professor in the department of occupational therapy at San Jose State University, testified she began dating Richards in February 2010, but it wasn't until December 2010 that she began traveling with him extensively.

During pretrial hearings, Marin District Attorney Edward Berberian presented evidence showing that Richards deposited the \$350,000 housing loan in his Citibank account on Dec. 3, 2010.

Berberian asked Andonian if she remembered traveling to Munich, London, Paris, Venice, Barcelona, Florence, Rome and Croatia with Richards. Andonian said she recalled going to Europe with Richards, but she said she didn't recall specific locations they visited.

Berberian asked Andonian if she recalled taking trips to Las Vegas with Richards.

"I recall one trip to Las Vegas," Andonian said. She also confirmed the trips to Alaska, Croatia and the Cayman Islands.

Richards dropped from sight in July 2012 shortly after local political writer Dick Spotswood, in a column published by the Marin Independent Journal, raised questions regarding whether Richards used the \$350,000 loan to purchase housing. Richards resigned by email from his \$197,000-a-year job on July 25, 2012.

Andonian also testified she met Richards in the Philippines in August 2012. After that, Andonian said she communicated sporadically with Richards via phone and email until March 2013.

Andonian said she didn't hear from Richards again until July or August of 2013.

Berberian questioned Andonian about a telephone conversation she had with Richards while he was in jail awaiting trial. Inmate calls are recorded, and Berberian showed her a transcript of the conversation.

During the call, Andonian told Richards she had been distraught during the three months she couldn't reach him.

Berberian asked Andonian if Richards had replied that he had broke off contact with everyone he cared about because he was being investigated.

"I remember him being concerned about others getting hurt," Andonian said.

During pretrial hearings, Richards lawyers asserted that their client did not travel to the Philippines to elude authorities and was unaware that he was suspected of committing a crime.

Under cross-examination by Richards' co-counsel, Jai Gohel, Andonian testified that she accompanied Richards on numerous open houses around the Bay Area to assist him in his search for a house.

Also testifying Monday was Susanne Brown, an assistant city attorney with the city of Concord, who advised the Ross Valley Sanitary District when it was negotiating with Richards in 2009 over the terms of an earlier version of his housing loan. This \$125,000 loan, unlike the subsequent \$350,000 loan, would have required Richards to provide a deed of trust as security. Richards never used the earlier loan.

Brown said she spoke in detail with Richards about putting a clause in this earlier loan agreement that would have allowed him to promptly access \$45,000 in case he wanted to make a deposit on a real estate property.

Brown testified that Richards wanted to be able to move the money directly into his account without use of an escrow account. She said he became upset when she raised objections.

"He started screaming at me," Brown said. "I've never had a client talk to me like that before or since. He basically threw a hissyfit on the phone."

Brown said, "His reaction raised suspicions on my part."

Richards is charged with 13 felony counts including misappropriation of public funds, embezzlement and multiple counts of money laundering. He could face a up to 10 years in prison and \$1.5 million in fines if convicted.

DEPRIVATION OF RIGHTS UNDER COLOR OF LAW

Section 242 of Title 18 makes it a crime for a person acting under color of any law to willfully deprive a person of a right or privilege protected by the Constitution or laws of the United States

In July 2005 California AG Bill Lockyer's released findings by his Domestic Violence Task Force that determined the criminal justice system is failing to enforce DV laws.

- 1) Marin County, CA judges have a long history of denying orders of protection for victims of DV and child abuse, routine denial of all evidence and witnesses when the accused party fails to show up for the restraining order hearing. In cases involving child custody and domestic violence, sole custody or unsupervised visitation have been given to the perpetrators of abuse in direct conflict of child welfare and DV laws.
- 2) Ex-parte, secret, in-chambers meetings between the abuser, his attorney and the judge are used to change custody to the abuser. Ex-parte hearings are not allowed unless proper notice is given to the opposing party and she or a legal representative is present. Fraud Upon the Court can occur when any order is made under these circumstances, the order and subsequent orders made that rely upon the illegal order are invalid and not enforceable.
- 3) Conspiracy to obstruct justice happens when officers of the court assist each other to cover evidence of criminal activity committed by judges, attorneys and perpetrators of abuse. Conspiracy can occur when confidential court files are missing evidence that was supportive of the abuse or violence, as well as when psychiatric, psychological, medical, school and police reports are illegally removed from the files, motions for discovery denied, due process is ignored.

Police arrested Raymond Anciaux, 51, of Hercules last week on suspicion of calling and threatening the agent, who is black, according to Hercules police.

Hercules police Sgt. Joseph Vasquez, saying Anciaux was released from jail after prosecutors asked for further investigation, said he expects the case will wrap up in a week or two. He called the allegations surprising in light of Anciaux's job.

A Marin County spokesman said "the county does not comment on the status of employees or personnel matters."

The 51-year-old realty agent, who was not identified, held an open house Aug. 2 and authorities believe Anciaux's cellphone was used to call her several times and leave voice mails. Police said the caller used several racial and gender slurs, stated he didn't want her in his neighborhood and threatened to kill her.

Anciaux was arrested on suspicion of committing a hate crime and making annoying phone calls.

.Marin County Illegally Refuses Subsistence Money to Thousands of Poor Residents

Recent <u>coverage</u> in the Marin Independent Journal critical of the County's administration of its <u>General Assistance Program</u>.

SAN RAFAEL, CA – In California's wealthiest county live up to 6,000 desperately poor residents, most of them neglected by the County's government. In a lawsuit filed on January 31 in Marin County Superior Court, three destitute Marin residents charge that the County uses illegal and unfair methods to refuse subsistence aid to its most destitute population.

The suit, filed by Greg Versis, Alfredo Garcia and Lee A. Lee and backed by two major public interest law firms, asks the court to lend order, consistency and openness to the County's methods for dispensing General Assistance (GA) funds. GA is a county program which provides a small monthly stipend (about \$387 a month) to indigent adults.

While California law requires counties to distribute GA funds fairly, the lawsuit charges that Marin County shirks this duty by running its GA program "according to *ad hoc*, unpublished, ever-changing, and often unwritten rules that result in the inhumane termination of last resort aid." Moreover, plaintiffs allege that the County is breaking state law by cutting people out of GA assistance without first making the required findings of good cause.

The result: Just 450 of the county's indigents, many of whom are disabled, are given the few dollars they need to survive, and even those people face arbitrary cut-offs. The rest have fallen through the safety net. In the past 11 years, the complaint alleges, about 139 homeless people have died on the streets of Marin County and many more have been left hungry, ill, and unable to pay for shelter.

Kristen Washburn, an attorney with Bay Area Legal Aid, one of the organizations representing the plaintiffs, saw her client lose his GA benefits and then his housing. "He couldn't pay his rent and was evicted. He was living in a tent during the coldest and wettest time of the year," she said. "Then there was a cold snap and a lot of rain, and he told me his tent was leaking. I wondered how he was going to survive."

The suit alleges that Marin has shunned its indigent population for decades. "The Board of Supervisors has ignored this critical, last-resort benefit, and the very poorest members of this affluent county for more than 30 years," said Bob Capistrano, another lawyer with Bay Area Legal Aid. "Welfare workers are cutting people out of GA based upon nonsensical, unfair, and illegal rules they seem to be making up as they go along."

Plaintiff Alfredo Garcia, 49, a former construction worker who was sidelined by work injuries, was able to receive GA but he fears losing this lifeline because it is nearly impossible to understand and follow the County's many arbitrary requirements. For example, he and other recipients have to file monthly status reports and are threatened with possible termination even if they file the reports one day *early*. "I really worry about all of the other people who rely on GA and the many folks who lose it every month." Garcia said. "It isn't much money, but it is all we have to survive."

"We are asking the court to order Marin County to follow the law," said Judith Gold of the Public Interest Law Project, which is also representing the plaintiffs. "That means it can't cut people off from this critically needed aid for violating program rules unless the violations are truly their fault. It also cannot keep running this program under unwritten standards that the Board of Supervisors has not reviewed or approved. While we recognize that counties are under pressure to save money, this will save money in the long run by allowing more people to get out of costly shelter beds and into stable housing."

The Public Interest Law Project provides crucial litigation and advocacy support to local legal services and public interest law programs throughout California. (http://www.pilpca.org). Bay Area Legal Aid is the largest provider of free civil legal services in the Bay Area. Bay Legal and PILP have frequently worked together to ensure access to the GA safety net. They have successfully pursued a number of General Assistance cases against other counties, including Contra Costa and Alameda.

Elite Marin County Politicians Play Favorites and "Political Payback" With Public Funds

More than 21,000 people live below the federal poverty level in Marin County, and 1,900 are children under 6 years old, a new study reports.

Marin's overall poverty rate checks in at 8.4 percent, a measure that involves a family of four earning less than \$23,550 a year, but the rate hits a lofty 12.8 percent for Marin children under 6.

"Poverty in the Bay Area," a new analysis by San Rafael economist Jon Haveman, focuses on the region as a whole, but provides striking insights about Marin County as well.

"It does surprise me that the poverty rate here is so high," Haveman said. "It peaked at 9.5 percent in 2011."

As for the high poverty rate involving young children, the lack of affordable child care is a problem, he said, adding 30 percent of all youngsters across the Bay Area live in households involving a single mother.

Haveman, who heads Marin Economic Consulting and has monitored the regional pulse since 2001, said that when measured by a more rigorous California poverty indicator that adjusts for the cost of living, Marin's poverty rate is somewhere between 17 percent and 19 percent — not much better than the state's 22 percent average. He added that as far as meeting a separate "self sufficiency" standard that also accounts for the cost of living, almost 30 percent of Marin residents are unable to make ends meet adequately, about the same as the rest of the Bay Area.

"Marin has a have and have-not economy," Haveman said. "The wealthiest county in the Bay Area has levels of economic hardship comparable to the region as a whole."

Heather Ravani, assistant director of the county Health and Human Services Department, said Haveman's observation comes as no surprise. "Marin may be the healthiest and one of the wealthiest counties in the state, but every day thousands of our children are hungry and falling behind, and our families struggle to meet their basic needs," Ravani said. "Until we as a community change our focus and move to support and improve these conditions, we will continue to see this gap widen and see our children unable to escape a life of poverty."

Amy Reisch, executive director of the First 5 Marin Childrens and Families Commission, said the new study backs data already on hand. "It's clear we have an unacceptable level of poverty," Reisch said. "We've known there's a big disparity in Marin, and for children in particular, we're not doing all we can."

Marin childcare activists are working on a 2016 quarter-cent sales tax measure that would raise \$10 million a year to benefit impoverished children. County supervisors have allocated \$50,000 for a plan outlining how funds raised by a sales tax for kids would be used, information needed to persuade voters the tax makes sense.

Children's advocates including MarinKids last year reported more than 800 families were on a waiting list for affordable child care, nearly 60 percent of elementary and middle school children are unsupervised after school, and hundreds of Marin children live below the federal poverty level. While 91 percent of white children attend preschool, only 32 percent of Latino kids attend. Only 30 percent of children from poor families score well in English, compared to 82 percent of others.

Haveman said he was unaware of the ballot plan.

As a region, Haveman's study indicated the Bay Area has an 11.3 percent poverty rate that hovers near historic highs, with more than 800,000 people living below the poverty line. Poverty plagues the region even though "the Bay Area has a fast-growing frontier economy that is the starting point for much of the technology created nationwide," the study noted.

How Corruption In Marin County, California works!

One glowing example of the darkness that Marin officials use to regularly hide payola is exemplified in one recent example of agency boundoggling.

A senior Education Department official who abruptly resigned last month after a dispute with Secretary Betsy DeVos received hundreds of thousands of dollars in off-the-books

bonus pure profit corruption payola over a seven-year period, according to a new report. Over 30 Marin officials are suspected of using this same payola tactic.

James Runcie, an Obama administration appointee who served as chief operating officer of the Federal Student Aid office, received secret, five-figure bonuses each year while his office gave out billions in improper payments, It was recently <u>reported</u>, citing sources inside the Education Department.

While Runcie ran the FSA, the government's \$1.4 trillion financial aid program, the office made improper payments for the federal Pell Grant program, which ballooned from \$562 million in 2015 to \$2.21 billion in 2016, and for the Federal Direct Loan program, which increased from \$1.28 billion in 2015 to \$3.86 billion in 2016.

"These are disbursements that either shouldn't have been made, went to the wrong recipient, were for an incorrect amount, or were not properly documented," it was reported, adding that "under Runcie's leadership there was pervasive fraud and corruption at the FSA."

A government source told investigators that Runcie's personnel file showed a total of \$432,885 in bonuses over a seven-year period, culminating in a \$76,000 bonus in 2016. The bonuses do not appear on Runcie's official government salaries.

Runcie resigned last month after DeVos asked him to testify before Congress on the rising rate of improper payments in student aid, *BuzzFeed* reported. The resignation came the day before DeVos was set to testify about the new proposed federal budget.


"I cannot in good conscience continue to be accountable as chief operating officer given the risk associated with the current environment at the [Education] Department," Runcie wrote in his resignation memo.

This form of corruption via government financed payola is called a "Layered Skim" in FBI circles.

A large number of Marin County officials are now under FBI, and other group investigation, because the money in question moved between states.

"Bonuses" in Marin County government reports are now receiving laser-like inspection for years 2007 to 2017.

Three in four Americans (75%) last year perceived corruption as widespread in the country's government. This figure is up from two in three in 2007 (67%) and 2009 (66%).



While the numbers have fluctuated slightly since 2007, the trend has been largely stable since 2010. However, the percentage of U.S. adults who see corruption as pervasive has never been less than a majority in the past decade, which has had no shortage of controversies from the <u>U.S. Justice Department's firings of U.S. attorneys</u> to the <u>IRS</u> scandal.

.Try To Build It "Green" And Local Government Will Make You Go Bankrupt

A 48-unit Napa Creek Village condo-style housing development in Napa was built with light-gauge steel panels framed in a south Napa factory. (HEALTHY BUILDINGS USA) 2018. Now there is sadness as the "green" project went from green to red.

Chris d Craiker, AIA, NCARB, has been designing affordable and sustainable housing for almost 50 years. He has watched local bureaucracy crater most of the well-intentioned building projects in the area.

After years of planning and design, Napa Creek Village started construction in 2016 for a zero energy project (ZEP) community.

Five years later, it has gone through multiple bankruptcy lawsuits; and with a \$12 million bank obligation was sold for around \$7 million. It will probably take another \$5 million to complete the 46,000-square-foot housing project. Based on the total construction cost, the projected budget would be over \$370 per square foot, comparable to a custom single-family home.

What went wrong? More importantly, can affordable housing be built that is sustainable, affordable and eco-friendly?

Napa Creek Village was intended to provide substantial high-energy conservation, sustainability and zero energy use by collecting energy with extensive solar panels and greywater recycling. It was to be the state-of-the-art of zero energy use while meeting Napa city's affordability requirements for eight of the total 48 units.

Originally designed as workforce housing and to be sold as condominiums, the project will now be rented at today's elevated market rates, with eight units kept at low- to medium-income rental levels. So much for workforce housing affordability.

In May, construction restarted with R.D. Olson Construction general contractors. The new owners, OSM Investment Company, purchased the property earlier this year after it languished on the market for months with potential buyers reeling from sticker shock of what needed to be completed.

I spoke with Scott Herron, senior project manager for R.D. Olson about why the project is so over budget. He described the challenges for completing the project, stating, "OSM Investment is dedicated to preserving the original intent of the design to maintain the low-

energy usage, high sustainability approved as designed." These concepts go back almost 10 years.

Some better news: Most of the structural framing has been completed, although in steel studs, a product with a rating for Environment Product Declaration (EPD). Steel studs, and in general all-steel construction, is highly carbon embedded. This means it takes lots of energy to mine, produce, transport and assemble. While touted as a renewable product, it is the most environmentally unfriendly construction product available today. Only concrete is as poor a construction product for EPD rating as steel.

Steel stud construction is often mistaken as fireproof, but unfortunately when heat is applied to steel, it deforms and fails. Believe it or not, heavy timber wood construction has a lower flame spread rating and is more heat resistant than steel. The design and execution was driven by untested quasi-alternative construction techniques. Sometimes false narratives drive a project rather than well-founded construction techniques. Today, hybrid systems using tried-and-true construction methods and procedures are essential for a project's success. When all the team is on the same page, the game can be won.

The reason professional builders are able to build tract houses fast and affordable even in today's market, is because they are well-managed and schedule-driven. While the pandemic has stretched supply lines and seen schedules and costs escalate, most of Napa Creek Village was failing before the shutdowns.

Affordability and sustainability are not mutually exclusive. When construction follows the highest industry practices and provides well-managed construction from the very beginning with a team of dedicated architects, contractors, subcontractors, managers and financial factions, a project can proceed successfully and provide much-needed rental housing our communities desperately need.

Marin projects could use the following construction resources to solve every housing issue BUT Marin Officials are owned by special interest real estate and union interests and they hate these kinds of modern construction:



In four hours one Wednesday, a 1,300-square-foot house in Napa went from slab to completion.

No, it wasn't an all-hands-to-hammer benefit workbee that put up the three-bedroom, two-bathroom home on Dealy Lane in hours instead of months. Instead, it was done by a California startup that's part of a growing move into factory-built housing.

One of the firms building homes in a factory instead of onsite is Factory_OS which is ramping up this spring in a 275,000-square-foot factory on Vallejo's Mare Island. That company already has orders for thousands of factory-built dwellings for Google and municipal housing authorities.

Napa-based Healthy Buildings USA has its much smaller factory turning out panels for installation at a 48-unit development under construction in the city.

The Napa home on Dealy Lane is the first in the North Bay for nearly 2-year-old Plant Prefab, which also last week installed over two days a custom 16-unit dormitory in Berkeley for educational farm and community center Urban Adamah. It is said to be the first prefabricated multifamily project in the East Bay city. In the past year, Plant Prefab opened its own factory, secured \$3.4 million in series A funding led by Obvious Ventures and shipped six other housing units throughout California. The 62,000-square-foot facility is located in Rialto, located midway between Los Angeles and Palm Springs.

The single-story Napa home was built there in three dwelling modules plus a roof unit. The sections were then shipped to a staging area near the construction site, where crews were finishing preparation of the foundation. With construction in the factory occurring concurrently with build-site preparation, the total time to get the home from dirt to dining room can be reduced by as much as half, and neighborhood disruption can be lessened, not to mention potential for less waste in construction materials, according to founder and CEO Steve Glenn.

'In that area, it's important to consider prefab as a solution, because contractors so busy, and costs going up,' Glenn said.

The company has other North Bay projects in the pipeline, particularly for those who were among the thousands who lost homes in the North Bay's October wildfires, according to Glenn. The company is working with four such owners to install two homes in the coming months in Santa Rosa on burned sites and two outside the scorched areas — one in Sebastopol and the other in Half Moon Bay. The Southern California company is offering special pricing for victims of the fire, including free initial site assessments, half-off of feasibility services, \$5,000 in free upgrades and 5 percent off design and administrative fees.

Plant Prefab was spun off from LivingHomes, a designer of dwellings that conform to high levels of the LEED for Homes green-building standard. The Napa home is based on the LivingHomes C6P ranch-style home with a pitched roof and targets the highest level of LEED for Homes, which is Platinum.

While the owner of the Napa home may or may not pursue the arduous certification process for LEED for Homes Platinum, the modules were built to tick off items on that checklist, Glenn said. The modules are plumbed to connect to greywater recycling systems, have roof blocking and conduits for solar panels and are finished with low- or nonvolitile-organic-compound (VOC) paints.

LEED for Homes Platinum is hard to get because it involves water usage, flyash content of the concrete, indoor air quality, according to Bob Massaro, founder of Healthy Buildings USA in Napa and a longtime member of the local chapter of the U.S. Green Building Council, which created the LEED standard.

'I've not seen any factories be able to build to LEED (for Homes) Platinum,' Massaro said. 'Michelle Kaufmann and BluHomes tried to do it, but I have not seen it work long term. Plant Prefab would be the first.'

Kaufmann is considered a pioneer in high-end modular housing and operated a prefab company in the East Bay. BluHomes had been operating in the same building Factory_OS now has before exiting about a year ago and outsourcing manufacturing.

'One of my business principles is to keep overhead small,' Massaro said about his decision to keep his factory on a small scale. But California's approval of the accessory-dwelling-unit ordinance last year and the loss of so many homes in Sonoma, Napa and Mendocino counties from the wildfires has brought competition from a number of modular-home companies looking to market to fire victims, he said.

Massaro's factory is currently focused on building light-gauge steel panels for the company's Napa Creek Village project in Napa. Slowed by the heavy rains of last year, the project now has two of the eight residential buildings erected, and a foundation is being poured for a third.

To achieve its LEED for Homes Platinum target, Healthy Buildings USA designed Napa Creek Village with greywater recycling for the showers to go into irrigation and a wafflemat foundation system designed to reduce the amount of concrete.

The estimate for the LivingHomes C6P model that was installed in Napa in hard construction costs is about \$275 a square foot, as figured for the Los Angeles area, plus at least 8 percent for soft costs such as design and engineering. The company works with local contractors for installation and also works with clients' design teams.

'We're set up to do rectolinear projects,' Glenn said. 'If you want undulating curves, we couldn't do that, but the vast majority of designs are rectolinear. We let clients know about changes they would need to make to build their home most efficiently in the factory. Some are willing to do the changes, and some won't. We don't make claims we can do everything.'

Many think of factories of turning out mass quantities of the same product, as in electronics or cars, but facilities for making big items such as homes, airplanes and ships often are configured to allow for customization from one unit to the next, Glenn said.

'For each boat or plane, they have each component for that model delivered to each station, so they can do custom work more efficiently,' he said.

The Napa and Berkeley projects are wood-framed, but an upcoming single-family home project on the San Francisco Peninsula is specified for light-gauge steel framing. The factory is also set up for working with heavy structural steel needed for larger projects.

.Tiburon Just Wanted A Town Hall But They Got A Bloodbath

Erik Ingram of The Chronicle North Bay Bureau reports on the insanity in Marin's Tiburon/Belvedere bergs.

A new majority on the Tiburon Town Council early yesterday told its five-member Planning Commission to resign or be fired for supposedly trying to delay a long-sought project -- the controversial new town hall.

The surprise move, spearheaded by Mayor Nicky Wolf, came in the wee hours of the morning as the regular council meeting concluded, prompting critics to dub it a "midnight massacre."

"It was quick, quiet and nasty," said Commissioner Randy Greenberg, one of two planners in the sparse, post-midnight audience. "This is unprecedented in Marin County."

Wolf, supported by council members Terry Hennessy and Andrew Thompson, said the ultimatum was issued because of a "lack of confidence" in the commission, which she described as obstructionist.

"There are a few instances in which I feel they have acted arbitrarily," the mayor said. "I want a broad range of opinion on the commission . . . but I also want people who are reasonable. It's difficult not to characterize the commission as obstructionist."

Two other council members, Gerry Thayer and Mark Ginalski, criticized the move as an effort to eliminate a hardworking and environmentally concerned commission that has raised legitimate issues regarding the new town hall's planned downtown location.

"This is a council that doesn't want to hear other opinions; it sees them as evil," said Thayer. "Isn't it ironic that this is happening just before several major land-use and open space issues are due to come before the Planning Commission?"

Behind the ouster is one of Tiburon's longest running and most bitterly fought municipal free-for-alls -- the siting of a new town hall to replace a dilapidated World War II barracks that has served as city hall for years.

After rejecting two ballot measures, voters last year gave the go-ahead for a downtown structure on

Tiburon Boulevard. The plan is endorsed by the council majority. Thayer and Ginalski had supported building a town hall adjacent to the existing structure on the outskirts of town.

Two weeks ago, however, the Planning Commission declined to go along with the town's position that an environmental impact report would not be required for the project.

Commissioners instead voted 4 to 1 for a limited environmental report that would study the seismic stability of the site, evaluate the two-story building's impact on views and analyze parking issues.

But the city staff, its environmental consultants and engineering experts all agreed no environmental impact report is needed, according to Wolf.

In a prepared statement read at the close of the meeting, she recommended the entire commission be dumped and "a new, more balanced commission" be appointed. The ousted commissioners could reapply, she said, adding some might be reappointed.

Council members Hennessy and Thompson agreed that an overhaul of the commission is needed. Hennessy's election last November tipped the balance on the council.

As matters stand, the five commissioners -- Greenberg, Paul Schrier, Marilyn Siewert, Lisa Klairmont, and Michael Heckmann -- have been ordered to resign or facing firing during a special Town Council meeting at 6 p.m. Wednesday. The unpaid commissioners serve at the council's pleasure.

Schrier, a land-use attorney who attended the council meeting Wednesday night, said he was disappointed and predicted that none of the five planning commissioners would leave voluntarily.

"This will polarize the town and squash all useful public debate," he said. "They will end up staffing the commission with people who will do what the council wants or they'll face removal."

The environmental review sought by the commission would have delayed the project only three or four months, Schrier said.

The dissenting council members, Thayer and Ginalski, noted that the shakeup comes just as several sensitive issues are due for commission review.

Those include a developer's plan to build about 40 luxury homes on a 120-acre parcel at the eastern tip of the Tiburon Peninsula, a location offering some of the Bay Area's most dramatic views of San Francisco and the bay.

Also in the works is a proposal by a private athletic club, the Tiburon Peninsula Club, to expand its facilities -- possibility requiring a realignment of busy Mar West Street.

Another sensitive issue is a proposal to use undeveloped city property adjacent the existing town hall for additional senior citizens housing.

"This Wednesday night massacre will usher in a new era of development," Thayer said.

If you think that sounds nuts, try this: In the middle of a tangle of mansion-laden, suburban streets, the graffiti-covered, half-finished lava house seems a bit out of place.

Few people know how it got there, but it was the local teenagers who christened it, thanks to heaps of lava rocks strewn about the property. Built by Jerry Ganz (the fabulously wealthy man responsible for the mass production of seat-belts), the Lava House's chief architectural pull was its extensive use of imported lava rock. Ganz faced numerous roadblocks by the city. He spent almost 20 years fighting city officials to get his architectural fantasy approved. Construction stopped only two years later after they were finally approved, and it has remained empty to this day. Ganz left it as an eyesore as revenge against the Tiburon Planning Department.

The City of Tiburon has tried desperately to sell it off, even razing what was left of the structures there after a 1997 fire to attract more buyers, but to no avail. It is mostly used these days as an impromptu party locale or a haunt for photographers trying to get a good view of the Bay, but exploring the maze of steep staircases, hidden subterranean rooms, and twisting balconies is also popular, both by night and by day.

."You Want To Build Housing In Marin?" "HA!"

Ike Allen describes yet another cluster-fuck of anti-building obfuscation in Marin: Farmworker housing advocates are facing some hard lessons from a pilot project that fell drastically short of its goal. Starting in 2012, a collaborative between the Marin Community Foundation and Marin County used a combination of public and private funds to build and renovate agricultural worker housing on ranches in West Marin. The group initially planned to fund 200 units within five years, but later sharply reduced the goal to 20 units.

In the end, only a dozen units were built, while the need for more affordable housing never went away and only got 800 times worse.

"There were a number of lessons learned, including that using public funding on private land is really challenging," said Leelee Thomas, the planning manager with the Marin County Community Development Agency who led the project.

Agricultural jobs are sometimes more desirable than other jobs in West Marin because they usually come with housing. On dairy farms in particular, it's essential that workers live onsite or very nearby.

"They need to work two shifts," said Socorro Romo, executive director of West Marin Community Services. "What they do is basically eat, sleep and work." A commute simply does not fit into the schedule.

But having one's housing tied to one's work also presents a challenge. "When they lose their job, they lose their house," Ms. Romo said.

By 2012, a number of ranches in West Marin had shuttered, including Drakes Bay Oyster Farm, which displaced 32 workers. At the same time, the Marin Community Foundation had been preparing to spur a project to remedy the ongoing need for farmworker housing.

A collaborative led by M.C.F. and the county involved a host of organizations, including West Marin Community Services, the Community Land Trust Association of West Marin, the Marin County Farm Bureau, the West Marin Fund and the Marin Agricultural Land Trust.

Through the pilot project, the group tried to secure long-term, low-interest loans from the United States Department of Agriculture for ranchers to build housing. M.C.F. contributed \$1 million, and property owners had to match the funding for each unit with either cash, land or utilities costs. Current workers would be prioritized, and no worker would pay more than 30 percent of their income for rent.

But in most cases, restrictions on the federal funds proved prohibitive. "With that model, it wasn't feasible," Ms. Thomas said.

Johnathan Logan, the vice president of community engagement at M.C.F., said a 2015 post-mortem report on the project found that a lack of funds available for private land was the biggest obstacle. Public financing was simply too restrictive.

The project did result in the construction or renovation of some units. One unit was replaced on the historic J Ranch, two were rehabilitated at Toluma Farms in Tomales, three were built at the Giacomini dairy, two at Bivalve Dairy, one at Stubbs Vineyard, and two at the Straus dairy. They're nearly all still occupied, and all but two are rent-free for the workers who live there.

Tim Kehoe, whose family has been ranching at the J Ranch for 100 years, said the project allowed him to replace an aging trailer with a new manufactured home built by Little House on the Trailer, a Petaluma-based business. He secured funding from the county and M.C.F., and provided \$10,000 to \$15,000 in kind. Although he leases public land, he wasn't eligible for a U.S.D.A. loan since his five-year lease was much shorter than the 30-year term of the loan.

Mr. Kehoe doesn't charge rent for the unit, and he pays all the utilities himself.

At Toluma Farms, dairy farmers Tamara Hicks and David Jablons didn't qualify for a U.S.D.A. loan because of their income, which is boosted by Mr. Jablons's job as chief of thoracic surgery at U.C.S.F. They began rehabilitating two housing units on their farm but, Ms. Hicks said, it has been too expensive to finish. In the meantime, they've housed some workers rent-free in units they own in Tomales and Dillon Beach.

John Taylor, who runs Bivalve Dairy with his wife, Karen, replaced two older manufactured homes with a duplex manufactured by Karsten in 2015. The county put up the funding for the permit cycle, and initially told Mr. Taylor that the units would be funded by a U.S.D.A. loan. The Taylors paid for the unit themselves, but the restrictions of the loan turned out to be too burdensome, requiring them to work with the land's other owners, Ms. Taylor's family, to put a lien on the property.

"We were left holding the bag, going, 'Okay, we just built this house,'" he said.

Mr. Taylor charges rent on the two units, docking it from workers' wages.

Straus Family Creamery founder Albert Straus was part of the farmworker housing collaborative and had two three-bedroom manufactured houses built on his dairy in Marshall as a result. A turnover in the project's management interrupted the process of getting a U.S.D.A. loan, and although the county waived certain fees and expedited the process, he had to take out a loan from his own bank. Mr. Straus doesn't charge rent.

He said the project was not a long-term solution for the needs of workers and farmers. It went through three managers while he was involved, and faced various obstacles to funding in the form of federal, county and state requirements.

"The management wasn't ideal, and the execution wasn't ideal either," Mr. Straus said.

This spring, Mr. Straus moved the creamery operation to Petaluma, closer to where he said many employees already live. His attention is still trained on affordable housing projects in West Marin, and he is working with the county on a potential development in Tomales. "It's not only ag worker housing, it's affordable housing," he said of the problem. "The whole community's housing needs have become extreme."

One dairy did meet the conditions for a low-interest U.S.D.A. loan: Point Reyes Farmstead Cheese Company. Co-owner Lynn Giacomini Stray was able to replace three modular homes for workers on the property. "We were happy that we qualified, and we really would like to see more of that," she said.

The dairy doesn't charge rent or utilities, and Ms. Stray said she'd like to see more affordable housing options close to or on ranches and farms in West Marin. "Our employees have to be close to work, because animals are a 24-hour operation," she said.

Ms. Thomas said there were "some things we could learn from that project that would still be feasible," but the county and M.C.F. are now primarily focused on off-ranch affordable housing in West Marin. Of the units that CLAM will develop on the former Coast Guard property in Point Reyes Station, a certain number may be set aside specifically for agricultural workers.

Mr. Logan, who arrived at M.C.F. in 2016, said the foundation's report acknowledged that the 2012 project had not come close to meeting the need for farmworker housing.

Before the pandemic hit, the collaborative had reopened the conversation and was planning a needs assessment study. Mr. Logan said the group will likely meet again within the next month. They plan to survey the number of farmworkers and housing units in Marin and to identify more opportunities for housing on private land. Funding is still an obstacle, however, with regulations on public monies often onerous for private farmers.

Ms. Thomas said she doesn't know of a source of public housing funding meant for private landowners.

One group may be able to exert particular influence on farmworker housing through financial incentives: the Marin Agricultural Land Trust, which has control over the development rights for 54,000 acres of Marin farmland.

"MALT needs to play a role in this," Mr. Logan said.

Jennifer Carlin, MALT's director of advancement, wrote in an email that the trust "believes that everyone engaged in the agricultural value chain deserves a dignified living, including a safe and healthy place to live." MALT's easements allow any agricultural infrastructure that's necessary to support the farming operation, including housing for workers.

Ms. Carlin said MALT is continuing to meet with M.C.F. and other groups as part of the collaborative, but the trust doesn't have its own committee to address housing needs. You may have noticed some headlines a few months back about how filmmaker George Lucas has decided to get in to the affordable housing business. In April, he announced plans to spend more than \$100 million of his own money to build apartments for workers and low-income seniors on a rural plot of land he owns in Marin, a wealthy county just north of San Francisco where he's lived and worked for many decades.

This news got a lot of coverage and inspired a lot of puns about how Lucas was "Striking Back" against his neighbors, after they'd resisted his earlier efforts to build a movie studio on that same piece of land. But there's a deeper story underneath all this — that has to do with just how hard it can be to build affordable housing in a place that is anything but.

Marin County has some of the most expensive housing in the nation. The county is full of beaches, redwoods and rolling hills. It's also right next to San Francisco's booming tech economy.

But Marin has very limited housing stock: more than 80 percent of Marin has been set aside never to be developed.

In Marin, the average monthly rent for a one-bedroom apartment is more than \$1,700 dollars. The median home price is more than \$800,000. It has one of the highest median incomes and highest levels of income inequality in the nation. Lots of high earners call it home — movie stars, lawyers and doctors. But middle-income folks like teachers and nurses? Not so much. Many of them commute from other less-expensive counties.

And low-income workers mostly cluster in Marin's few higher-density areas near the freeway, doubling or tripling up in units.

Sharon Mincheff lived in one of those over-crowded apartment buildings in Marin until a few years ago.

She worked as a care-giver for the elderly. Then she lost her job and couldn't afford her apartment anymore. For a time, she was homeless.

"Everything happened all at once in my life," Mincheff says. "I was at the age where there's not a lot of options out there for you."

After Mincheff lost her home, she found her way to a shelter. The waiting list to get in to most affordable housing units in the county was more than 10 years long. But a counselor told her that because she was a low-income senior, she would be put on a slightly shorter list. Her wait was about four years. Eventually, there was an open unit at a new affordable complex called Toussin Senior Apartments.

Toussin is located in Kentfield, one of Marin's most expensive towns. The complex is a little cluster of 13 apartment units. They're painted sage green, Craftsmen style, and designed to blend in as well as they can with the multimillion-dollar homes in the hills just above it, further up a little leafy street. Mincheff says she's discovered affordable housing projects like hers can carry a stigma in some parts of Marin.

"That you're gonna get low-life drug addict people," she says. "I so sometimes want to stand up and yell and scream, you know, that's not what comes here. You don't understand."

Mary Stompe is the CEO of the nonprofit, PEP Housing, that built Toussin Senior Apartments. She says it took 19 sources of funding to construct the 13 units. The whole project cost \$5.5 million to build. Funding came from a group of government agencies and grants and tax credits.

And each of these sources came with a different set of rules about what exactly their pot of money could be used to fund.

"If you see my spread sheet," Stompe says. "It is very large, and it can be mind blowing."

That's why Stompe says she's excited about the latest project she's leading, planned for a former piece of dairy land in northern Marin County. It is called Grady Ranch.

At 200 units, it will be one of the biggest affordable housing complexes in Marin County. And it's funded by one source: George Lucas. The filmmaker declined our request for an interview, but his spokesperson said that Lucas just wanted to do something nice for the people of Marin.

But not everyone in the county thinks his affordable housing project is such a nice idea.

We're looking at the issue of affordable housing through one place where housing is not exactly affordable: Marin County, just north of San Francisco.

George Lucas*, filmmaker and longtime Marin resident, says he'll use more than \$100 million to finance, entirely, 224 low-income apartments on a piece of land he owns called Grady Ranch, in an area called Lucas Valley — named long before the filmmaker moved there.

Some of the housing will be for low-income seniors and some will be so-called "workforce" housing, aimed at people who earn about 80 percent of the area's median

income. In Marin, that means between \$65,700 and \$101,400 a year depending on household size. A Lucas spokesperson said that Lucas wants to do something nice for seniors and workers in Marin.

Here are some of the different perspectives Marin County residents have on the project, as well as the larger issue of affordable housing in Marin:

Maria Rodriguez (left) is an administrative assistant who has worked for the County of Marin for 15 years. She lives in a small apartment with her husband in the Canal District, a crowded, industrial part of Marin.

"There's a lot of apartment buildings, sometimes two or three families to a unit," she says. "The rest is mostly auto repair shops and paint shops."

The day the details of George Lucas's affordable housing project came out, Rodriguez called PEP Housing, the non-profit developer that will be managing the project, and asked to be put on the waiting list for an apartment at Grady Ranch, once the units are built.

"I read it in the paper and I said 'Wow!' They took my name and number and said, 'We'll send you an update,'" she says. "I think it's wonderful."

Maggie McCann (right) is president of the Lucas Valley Homeowners Association. The well-manicured subdivision is a couple miles from Grady Ranch, down a winding country road.

When McCann heard that George Lucas was pushing ahead with plans for the affordable housing development, "it made my heart sink and my stomach feel bad," she says.

McCann says she has gotten emails from neighbors concerned with how many more kids the new housing will bring in to local schools, and how it will impact fire, police and other community services in the area.

"We are not against affordable housing," she says. "We just want to see it done in a sensible, responsible, good way."

Liz Dale (center) grew up in Lucas Valley and still lives there. She's on the board of the Lucas Valley Estates Homeowners Association.

"I used to ride my horse on this ranch when I was growing up. I think it's beautiful," Dale says.

She lays she doesn't want the design of the new buildings at Grady Ranch to interfere with the scenic environment and rural feel of the place or "stand out as a sore thumb."

Tom Taylor also lives in Lucas Valley Estates, and frequently hikes the ridge-top above Grady Ranch.

"There's trails back there that most of the people in this valley really cherish. I don't want to see a high rise if I'm hiking back in those trails."

Bruce Anderson (right) raised his children, and now his grandson, in Marinwood, another subdivision in Lucas Valley. He says he'd like to see the quality of life that drew him to the valley be available to families along the income spectrum.

"It can be shared with another 200 or 300 people in our 5,000-person valley here," he says. "I think we have one of the best school systems in Marin. They're doing a tremendous job for my grandson. I'd like that to be available to many more people."

Tarey Read (left) is the President of the Board of Directors of the Marinwood Community Services District. She has lived in Lucas Valley/Marinwood for more than twenty years, in a house her late husband bought in 1969 for \$19,700. Property values have skyrocketed since then.

She supports the affordable housing project George Lucas is planning for Grady Ranch. "I think this project is so well-conceived and so needed and appropriate."

Justin Kai (right) is also on the Board of Directors of the Marinwood Community Services District. Kai lives with his wife and infant son in Lucas Valley/Marinwood. His family moved to the neighborhood four years ago.

"It was a "financial stretch," he says, but they loved their home's big backyard and access to good quality schools.

"I made great sacrifices to be here," he says. "I think it's selfish to expect that someone else should be able to acquire (it) for little or next to nothing."

Commutes can be long for people who have jobs in expensive real estate markets like Marin County, a suburban enclave just north of San Francisco. And there are economic forces driving the long drives.

Consider the commute of Phillip Thomas, a communications technician for the County of Marin. His department maintains things like jail security cameras and radio equipment for fire departments. On a recent foggy morning, his drive to work took 55 minutes. "I was pleased about that," he says.

"Pleased" because, even though 55 minutes is twice the national average for a one-way commute, Thomas's trips often take even longer — up to 80 minutes. Thomas lives in Solano County, some 30 miles from where he works in Marin. He says he'd love to live

closer to his job, but when he's looked for homes in Marin "the housing prices are just too high."

Thomas earns more than \$80,000 a year. In Marin, where the median price for a single family home is around \$1 million, he wouldn't qualify for most home loans. So he drives in from somewhere else, just like most of his coworkers.

Depending on which Census survey you look at, between about 40 and 60 percent of the workforce in Marin commutes in from another county. Thomas says for him, that means more time on the road and increased frustration. "I hate traffic," he says. "But most of all it is a few hours out of the day that I don't get to spend with my family. And I like my family."

Beyond those personal costs, long commutes might also have impacts on the communities that workers like Thomas drive into each day to serve, says Thomas Peters, president of the Marin Community Foundation, which funds and advocates for more affordable housing in Marin County.

"You've got people that are making absolutely critical contributions to the life and quality of life for individuals and families in Marin," Peters says.

He argues that expensive places like Marin can benefit from having more of the pre-school teachers, the home health care workers, the MRI technicians that work in the county, able to live and raise their families there too.

"It's true at a cellular level and its true at a social level — there's a real payoff for diversity," Peters says.

On a more practical level, Peters warns that ultimately workers who can't afford to live in Marin may get so fed up with their commutes that they find jobs elsewhere, closer to home, leaving critical middle and low-income service jobs difficult to fill.





Figure 5: Marin Bike Riders Are Obsessed With Wearing Spandex And Corporate Logos

.Luke Skywalker Vs. The Marin NIMBY's



Legendary filmmaker <u>George Lucas</u>' latest weapon isn't a sleek lightsaber or a blast of Force lightning, but rather, affordable housing. He's even throwing in 50 to 70 million dollars worth of work to restore a stream in the area. That was the plan anyway, until Lucas finally decided to fold after two decades of fighting. Since his neighbors seemed to prefer residential use for the land, Lucas has decided to sell the property to an affordable housing developer.

"The level of bitterness and anger expressed by the homeowners in Lucas Valley has convinced us that, even if we were to spend more time and acquire the necessary approvals, we would not be able to maintain a constructive relationship with our neighbors...We plan to sell the Grady property expecting that the land will revert back to its original use for residential housing. We hope we will be able to find a developer who will be interested in low income housing since it is scarce in Marin. If everyone feels that housing is less impactful on the land, then we are hoping that people who need it the most will benefit," said Skywalker Properties in a released statement.

That press release reads more like sour grapes than a gracious gesture to help out Marin County's less well-off population, but if it comes to fruition, it could genuinely make a positive difference in people's lives, as opposed to just being a steel-framed middle finger to current residents.

"If affordable housing is eventually included in a future development proposal, it would help us meet our housing goals," said Brian Crawford, director of the Marin County Community Development Agency in an <u>interview</u> with the *Marin Independent Journal*.

This is turning gentrification on its head. Instead of Starbucks-sipping corporate hippies with graduate degrees creeping into historically low-income and working class neighborhoods, we have a population of fixed-income seniors and working families bombarding a wealthy neighborhood flush with open space and NIMBYism.

Then of course, the age-old question asked at every local meeting about development since the beginning of time, 'Affordable to whom?' According to the 2010 census, Marin County's median household income is \$89,268. To put that in perspective, the national median household income in 2010 was \$54,442. What is affordable in Marin County is a tad different than what would be Legendary filmmaker George Lucas' latest weapon isn't a sleek lightsaber or a blast of Force lightning, but rather, affordable housing. 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Dr. Thomas Peters, the president of the Marin Community Foundation-the organization that is partnering with Lucas on this affordable housing project told the Grio in an exclusive interview that he has complete faith in Lucas and his intentions even if the press release was dripping with bitterness.

"After so many years of fighting, a little frustration and anger is to be expected, but his track record speaks for itself. He's been responsible in every way," said Peters referencing Lucas's other real estate developments in which he followed through on his promises of open space and environmental impacts.

Peters said the project, which is only a week old and does not have any renderings or even a developer yet, would likely cater to Marin County's federally defined affordable definition of roughly \$40,000 for a single family and \$70,000-80,000 for a family of four.

The Marin Community Foundation, according to Peters, has a long track record of successfully placing lower income families and individuals within communities of much greater means.

"That's typically what we do here. The developers know how to incorporate beautifully designed structures that are sensitive to the community's needs," said Peters. "Plus, these are not people dropped in from Mars. They are working families and seniors who are good neighbors."

As for the Lucas Valley Homeowner's Estate Association, which has been a major thorn in Lucas's side, they said the plans took them by surprise. "We are glad we don't have to worry about the potential impacts we were worried about," said the organizations president Liz Dale to the Associated Press.

If Lucas's affordable housing project is realized, it will likely be a year to two years before a shovel is in the ground, even though he has provided all of his costly environmental, engineering and water studies to the Marin Community Foundation as a head start.

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.Marin's Cancer Problem

Marin County is rife with cancer. The stats prove it. Many thought it was from all of the plastic water bottles. Many thought it was because so many Marinites are alcoholics and drinking alcohol triggers your cells to grow cancerous. (A proven medical fact). The prestigious BUCK CENTER in Novato in Marin tried to medically study it but got their funding cut off when they got too close to the truth. The main reason Marin has so much cancer, especially breast cancer, seems to be the underground soil table flowing from the Chevron gasoline factory running along the east side of southern Marin county. Chemicals flow through porous soil under, through, and across the San Francisco bay like toxic soil rivers.

First, on the huge numbers of rich drunks in Marin: While some medical studies — and a great deal of media attention — have focused on possible health benefits of drinking alcohol in moderation, a large new report warns that the harms of alcohol greatly outweigh any potential beneficial effects. The authors of the study, which looks at data on 28 million people worldwide, determined that considering the risks, there is "no safe level of alcohol."

Alcohol is associated with 2.8 million deaths worldwide each year, the researchers found in the study, which is published in the journal The Lancet. Just over 2 percent of women and nearly 7 percent of men worldwide die from alcohol-related health problems each year.

Regular alcohol consumption can have negative impacts on the body's organs and tissues, while binge drinking can lead to injuries or alcohol poisoning. Alcohol dependence can lead to self-harm or violence.

"Previous studies have found a protective effect of alcohol on some conditions, but we found that the combined health risks associated with alcohol increase with any amount of alcohol," lead author Dr. Max Griswold, of the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation at the University of Washington, said in a statement. "In particular, the strong association between alcohol consumption and the risk of cancer, injuries, and infectious diseases offset the protective effects for ischemic heart disease in women in our study."

Drinking alcohol can lead to 7 kinds of cancer science has proven.

He added, "Although the health risks associated with alcohol starts off being small with one drink a day, they then rise rapidly as people drink more."

Across the globe, one in three people drink alcohol, equivalent to 2.4 billion people, according to the report.

For the study, the authors reviewed data from 694 studies to estimate how common drinking alcohol is worldwide. They also looked at 592 studies with data on 28 million people in 195 countries to study the health risks associated with alcohol.

Among the many findings, the research showed that drinking alcohol was the seventh leading risk factor for premature death and disease in 2016. That year, in people aged 15 to 49 years old, alcohol was the leading risk factor, with 3.8 percent of deaths in women and 12.2 percent of deaths in men connected to alcohol.

In this age group, the leading causes of alcohol-related deaths included tuberculosis, road injuries, and self-harm. In people age 50 and older, cancers were a leading cause of alcohol-related death, accounting for about 27 percent of deaths in women and 19 percent of deaths in men.

The researchers note that previous studies looking at the health benefits of alcohol have numerous limitations. These include that they're often self-reported, which relies on people recalling their drinking habits, which is subject to human error; or based on alcohol sales data, which doesn't always provide an accurate picture of people's individual consumption levels. Additionally, certain studies may not take into account that some non-drinkers may avoid alcohol because they already have health issues. Some studies also overlook illicit trade and home brewing.

The new study aims to correct these limitations by combining alcohol sales data with the prevalence of alcohol drinking and abstinence, self-reported data on the amount of alcohol consumed, tourism data to estimate the number of alcohol-drinking visitors to an area, and estimates of illicit trade and home brewing. The authors also used updated and more robust statistical review models to analyze alcohol consumption and the health problems associated with it.

In their review, the authors found that the only protective effect of alcohol came with reducing the risk of ischemic heart disease. There were also possible protective effects for diabetes and ischemic stroke, but these results were not statistically significant.

However, the risk of developing all other health issues increased with the number of alcoholic drinks consumed each day and the harms far outweighed the potential benefits, the authors report.

"Policies focusing on reducing alcohol consumption to the lowest levels will be important to improve health. The widely held view of the health benefits of alcohol needs revising, particularly as improved methods and analyses continue to shed light on how much alcohol contributes to global death and disability," Griswold said.

In an accompanying editorial, Dr. Robyn Burton of King's College London calls the research "the most comprehensive estimate of the global burden of alcohol use to date."

"The conclusions of the study are clear and unambiguous: alcohol is a colossal global health issue and small reductions in health-related harms at low levels of alcohol intake are outweighed by the increased risk of other health-related harms, including cancer," she writes.

Marin rich folks love their cell phones so they put up plenty of cell phone towers. Both the towers and the cell phones give you cancer, though. A fourth child has been diagnosed with cancer at another California elementary school, and parents believe it's because of radiation caused by a cell phone tower.

The towers are spread throughout the community, but it's this particular one that parents say needs to go.

"We had a doctor tell us that it's 100 percent environmental, the kind of tumor that he has," said Monica Ferrulli.

Her son Mason was the second child to be diagnosed with cancer in just three years at Weston Elementary. He was 10-years-old and walked by this cell phone tower daily.

"It's indescribable, it's really tough," she said.

"It's one of the hardest things that I've been through," said Joe Prime.

Prime's son Kyle was the first, diagnosed with kidney cancer in 2016. And two more kids were diagnosed this year.

"It just seems like coincidence is no longer a reason for all this illness," Prime said.

They believe it's this cell phone tower that's harming their kids.

"Kids shouldn't be guinea pigs and we shouldn't be taking chances with the children's lives," Prime said.

The district has had several tests done saying the tower is safe and meets federal regulations. But some families weren't convinced and hired an expert.

"I wouldn't send my kids there at all, it absolutely is dangerous," said Eric Windheim, an electromagnetic radiation specialist. "Children are still developing and their cells are still being divided. It's the worst possible time in their life to be exposed."

He says it's not just a cell tower, it also transmits wireless frequencies.

"Instead of only going 300 yards like regular Wi-Fi, Y-Max can go 30 miles," he said.

Parents want the mast removed, but the district won't budge. Parents say the district gets a kickback of \$2,000 a month to have the tower for a telephone company, but the district so far has not commented.

"It's a real disappointment that it's taking moms of sick children and dads of sick children to come out and say something needs to be done," Prime said.

Ferrulli's son Mason has also since relapsed and is undergoing brain cancer treatments while a fourth child from has recently been diagnosed and taken out of school.

They say it's not just a battle now for their children, but a fight these parents say they won't give up.

"There's a lot of kids that we love that still go to the school, so we are fighting for them," Ferrulli said.

The district sent out a letter to parents saying that the electric magnetic frequencies are far below federal standards and have completed a thorough investigation and do not have any plans of removing the cell phone tower on campus.

The biggest cause of cancer in Marin, though, Is the Richmond oil refinery running along the east side of Marin.

Chevron bribes almost every public official in the County government. Don't expect any help from them.

"Stay inside, close your windows and doors, and turn off air conditioning and heating units. Pets and all children in sporting activities should be brought inside, and have duct tape ready should you need to further seal windows and doors...."

These are among the "shelter in place" warnings made to Bay Area residents in response to a massive fire at the Chevron Corp.refinery in Richmond. The fire burned out of control for more than five hours, sending a giant black cloud of toxic chemicals, including sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxide, thousands of feet into the air and out across the bay. While automated calls went to more than 18,000 people, some 160,000 residents live in the areas directly affected by the warning. More than 5,700 people have sought medical treatment.

Chevron is the world's eighth-largest corporation and hands-down the largest in California. The Richmond refinery is also the state's single largest contributor to greenhouse gas emissions, having released 4.5 million metric tons of greenhouse gases in 2010 alone.

Built in 1902, the refinery shows its age. Rather than use its \$27 billion in 2011 profits to run the cleanest, safest and most transparent refinery possible, Chevron operates a refinery that is in constant violation of federal and state law and a daily threat to the health and safety of its workers and neighbors.

More than 25,000 people, including those in two public housing projects, live within just three miles of the refinery. Nearly 85% of the residents live below the federal poverty line; the same percentage is listed as "minorities" according to the U.S. Census. Within one mile of or abutting the refinery are businesses, houses, an elementary school and playgrounds.

Since at least April 2009, the refinery has been in noncompliance of the Clean Water Act and the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System in every quarter but one. Until July 2010, the refinery had been in "high-priority violation" of Clean Air Act compliance standards, the most serious level of violation noted by the EPA, since at least 2006. Under constant pressure from community organizations, Chevron has been assessed hundreds of thousands of dollars in penalties (EQUAL TO ½ DAY OF PROFITS) for repeated Clean Air Act violations — nearly 100 citations in just the last five years, including 23 in 2011 alone. A 2008 study by UC Berkeley and Brown University researchers concluded that the air inside some Richmond homes was more toxic than that outside because of harmful pollutants from the refinery being trapped indoors.

The Contra Costa County Health Services Department lists the residents of Richmond as one of the "most at-risk groups" in the county: They are hospitalized for chronic diseases at significantly higher rates than the county average, including for female reproductive cancers, which are more than double the county rate. Chevron is one of four refineries in Contra Costa County where nearby incidence of breast, ovarian and prostate cancers are the second highest in California, and where nearby residents suffer higher rates of death.

The Aug. 6 fire is the third major disaster at the refinery in 12 years, each caused by an old leaking pipe. In January 2007, an explosion rocked the refinery, leading to a five-alarm fire. A leaking corroded pipe "that should have been detached two decades ago," according to investigators, was to blame. In 1999, an 18,000-pound plume of sulfur dioxide smoke was released after an explosion caused by a leak in a pipe that was more than 30 years old.

But neither Richmond nor Chevron is alone. The U.S. Chemical Safety Board, an independent federal agency that investigates major incidents at oil refineries, concluded last month that nationwide safety at U.S. refineries has not improved, despite scores of fatalities, over the last decade, and won't until companies develop better safety systems.

In a 2007 report about BP's 2005 Texas City oil refinery disaster, which killed 15 workers, the board warned of a pervasive "complacency toward serious safety risks" across the leading oil companies' refinery operations. It called on the Occupational Safety and Health Administration to "require these corporations to evaluate the safety impact of mergers, reorganizations, downsizing and budget cuts."

Iran has a published hacking plan to try to hack into Chevron refineries and make them blow up.

Now compare this to the other "social democracies" that California is wont to compare itself with: Canada sits at spot number 111, while Norway is way down the list at number 153 (out of 176 countries).

In terms of inequality, California has more in common with banana republics than the "social democracies" it emulates. Perhaps they should get their own house in order before lecturing the rest of us on the benefits of socialism. California fails because it's Senators are crooks who have hundreds of millions of dollars in their bank accounts that they got

.What Is The New Marin "Wake Up" Really About?

Now nearly 1000 people are tied to the Provincetown, COVID Delta outbreak. Among those living in Massachusetts, 74% of them were fully immunized, yet officials said the vast majority were also reporting symptoms. Seven people were reported hospitalized.

The initial findings of the investigation led by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, in conjunction with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, seemed to have huge implications.

But that assumption had been based on studies of earlier versions of the virus. Delta was known for its "hyper-transmissibility," or as one former White House adviser put it "COVID on steroids."

"What has changed is the virus," said Dr. Anthony Fauci, the nation's top infectious disease expert and Biden's chief medical adviser.

When a vaccinated person gets infected with delta -- called a "breakthrough infection" -- "the level of virus in their nasopharynx is about 1,000 times higher than with the alpha variant," Fauci said in an interview Wednesday with MSNBC.

All indications now are that the Provincetown outbreak investigation is among the pieces of new evidence behind the CDC's decision to ask Americans to once again put on their masks indoors, even if they are vaccinated.

Before Provincetown, health officials had been operating under the assumption that it was extraordinarily rare for a vaccinated person to become infected with the virus. And if they did, they probably wouldn't end up passing it on to others, such as children too young to qualify for the vaccine or people who were medically vulnerable.

The idea that vaccines halt transmission of the virus was largely behind the CDC's decision in May suggesting vaccinated people could safely go without their masks indoors and in crowds, even if others were unvaccinated. The new data means that the vaccines cause, more, and *worse* COVID and that COVID keeps coming back around and killing more and more people. It shifts and hunts until it has gotten everyone on the planet.

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


Figure 6: Everybody In Marin Has Their Facebook Pages Filled With "HELPIE" Photos
